

2020 INVITATION TO BID (ITB)
Construction and Rehabilitation of the Wimauma Opportunity Center
PROCUREMENT METHOD CHANGE

After further consideration of the questions and comments provided during the Pre-Bid mandatory meeting that took place on Friday, May 8, 2020 from 10:00 am to 11:00 am at the Wimauma Opportunity Center, Enterprising Latinas, Inc. has decided to change its procurement method from the **Invitation to Bid (ITB)** to a **Request for Proposals (RFP)**. This change in procurement methodology will allow Contractors that attended the Pre-Bid mandatory meeting, to submit a construction and rehabilitation proposal based on their individual assessment. Contractors are encouraged to visit the facility again, to conduct assessments according to the Scope of Services.

The terms and conditions set forth in the original ITB will remain. Proposals must be received via email not later than 3:00 pm on Friday, May 22, 2020 at which time, all bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. Contractors are not required to attend the public bid opening. All Contractors will be notified of the decision via email within 3 business days from the May 22nd deadline. Bids received after the deadline will not be considered.
